Except in a medical emergency, a resident is not transferred or discharged, unless treatment is altered radically, without consultation with the resident or, if the resident is incompetent, without prior notification of next of kin or sponsor.</p>		<p>Ask Resident:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Have you ever been or do you know if others have been transferred or discharged without discussing it with you first? 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Nursing, physician and social work progress notes should be reviewed for evidence of discussion of transfer/discharge with resident or other designated person. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Except in an emergency, all transfers or discharges are first discussed with the resident or next of kin as evidenced by documentation in the medical record or confirmed by asking resident. 	
<p>INTERVIEW</p> <p>To assure that:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - the resident receives proper treatment in the event of an accident or change of condition. - resident and/or next of kin or responsible party is aware in advance of any changes. - resident is not discharged to gain a higher source payment for that bed or facility convenience.
